MANDATE

HREC Education furthers the teaching, study and understanding of the Holodomor, the 1932-33 Famine-Genocide in Soviet Ukraine, through six streams:

- **resource development**
- **educator training workshops**
- **presentations**
- **outreach**
- **promotion**
- **consulting**

HREC Education promotes inclusion of the Holodomor in school curricula and educational institutions. It develops instructional materials and training programs for educators that use best practice strategies and methodologies for teaching about the Holodomor across Canada, the USA and in Ukraine. It promotes an interactive multidisciplinary approach in the teaching of the Holodomor and trains educators to develop students' critical and historical thinking skills.

HREC Education organizes national conferences, consults and works with teachers, ministries of education, school boards, professional teacher associations, faculties of education, students, curriculum developers, museum educators and national and community organizations to ensure that the Holodomor is included as a topic in curricula related to human rights and genocide.

HREC Education co-directs, funds and participates in presenting the Verba Magistri Methodology Lab at The New Ukrainian School's Summer School Program to educators in Ukraine with HREC in Ukraine and the Ministry of Education and Sciences of Ukraine.

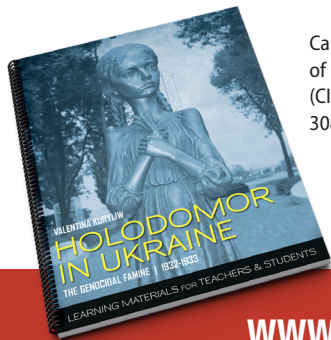
Holodomor Memorial Day

One of the major genocides of the 20th century, the Holodomor in Ukraine saw its 85th Commemoration in 2018. Each year the world commemorates the victims of the Holodomor on the **4th Saturday in November**; in schools on the **4th Friday in November**. HREC Education produces an annual downloadable educational pamphlet with resources for Holodomor Memorial Day. The Holodomor is also remembered in **April** during **Genocide Remembrance, Condemnation and Prevention** month.
